Wednesday, January 18, 2017 TASK FORCE MEETING

I. Welcome and Introductions of participants

Marie Harrison of Greenaction welcomed everyone to the meeting. The 2017 BVHP Youth Leadership Academy students were introduced.

II. Agenda review and Announcement of monthly meeting dates/locations for 2017 Task Force meetings

V. Presentation by CalRecycle: Maria Salinas, Environmental Justice Program Manager

Maria Salinas of CalRecycle facilitated a discussion on CalRecycle programs, services and decision making processes. Topics included: where to recycle; grants available; and, extended producer responsibility for convenient collections. Maria also discussed illegal dumping, the Environmental Justice Program and SEPs, and the Education and the Environmental Initiative.

Claudia, a CalRecycle executive, introduced the 'Where to Recycle' Map, an interactive mapping tool that provides the locations of recycling and collection facilities. This tool allows individuals to search by geographic location or by facility. You can also search more broadly within a jurisdiction, county, assembly or senate district boundary.

There were suggestions to provide the mapping tool as a link on IVAN as a resource.

The work provided by CalRecycle is available in print and on their website. Publications are updated every six months.

CalRecycle is currently accepting proposals for community projects. A representative will work with individuals and organizations throughout the process to address previous concerns raised on qualifying for funding.
